

Career Prep I, II, and Gen. Employability Skills-Work Based Learning Program

I am truly honored to serve you as your Work Based Learning Instructor.

The work based learning courses teach students employability skills in order to become productive citizens and to meet graduation requirements. These courses are determined by the ARD committee in order to supplement work skills needed for post-graduation employment. During your course you will go to a location within the community and work alongside employees in order to learn these skills. This is a non-paid, training position. You will always be accompanied by a district provided job coach and will be transported in a district vehicle.

While in the program through BBIA, you will work on the skills outlined in your personal IEP. Most of these skills will be done in the community with some time spent on campus to be used for personal care, social breakroom skills, and reinforcement of skills.

Grades will be given based upon data sheets completed by the job coaches. Grades are given as follows:

60% - Weekly Data Sheets

40% - Employer Evaluations – which are broken out below

Job Readiness/Employer Evaluation form completed by the job coach

Job Readiness/Employer evaluation by your VAC

Semester will be a Job Readiness /Employer evaluation form filled out by your community supervisor.

Dress Code – We are going out into the community so appropriate attire must be worn. In order to prepare you for the world of work we are asking that you bring a pair of **khakis or jeans** and a **solid-colored polo shirt** to school. This uniform will stay in the classroom. You will change into your uniform before leaving for work and change back into your school clothes before going to your next class. Laundry will be done once per week at school. Either wear or bring a pair of tennis shoes (or other comfortable, **closed toe shoes**) to complete your uniform.

If you do not have appropriate clothing for work you will either call your parents to bring you a set of work-appropriate clothes or possibly miss work for that day.

Technology- iPads, phones, iPods and other technology will not be allowed on the job site. Any needed technology will be provided by the job coach. On BBIA days, you may bring your technology to Ben Barber to be used for projects, training, and communication needs. Games, music and phone calls will not be allowed. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in a phone call to the parent for the first offense and a discipline referral for repeated offenses.

Student success is our number one priority. Parent phone calls and e-mails are made on a regular basis and grades will be updated regularly in Skyward. If you or your parent has any questions, never hesitate to call or e-mail Mrs. Harris. We are looking forward to a successful year!
